Wednesday Nights at Providence

Our small group series will also begin on January 11, 6:30-7:30 p.m. You will have the opportunity to get connected and be transformed with the following opportunities:

Faith From The Backside - Facilitated by Allen Branson (12 week series) in room 206. In his popular series of books "From the Back Side," J. Ellsworth Kalas looks at Christian topics through a new lens, takes unique starting points on those subjects, and uses creative retelling from different points of view.

In Faith from the Back Side, Kalas explores something that is central in a Christian life but often difficult to understand.

They Like Jesus, But Not The Church - Facilitated by Don and Elizabeth Kyser (6 week

series) in room 303. This DVD based study looks at the most common objections and misunderstandings cultures have about the church and Christianity. Through interviews and exploration of the scriptures, author and pastor Dan Kimball addresses six of the most common objections.

Knitters and Crocheters—learn to knit and crochet prayer shawls and hats for the church's outreach (room 307).

Mission for Youth and Kids (6 weeks) in room 309. All the children in the church are invited to a new kind of group. We are having all the children and youth together to explore areas of mission in our church and around the world. Each week we will have a different mission focus with different speakers, activities, and hands on mission work. Older youth will help younger children as each learns where God is leading them to make a difference in the world. Topics and activities would include: therapy dogs, hunger and food backpacks homelessness, and more.

CPR and AED Training

Providence UMC will be hosting CPR/AED training for church members and our community beginning in February. This is a noncertifying course from the American Heart Association that will inform participants about performing CPR on a victim and using an automated external defibrillator (AED) and will be facilitated by healthcare volunteers. There will also be a workshop at the end of each class

for participants to practice CPR on training manikins. The first class for church members will be on Wednesday, February 29, starting at 6:30. The next class, open to the community, will be on Wednesday, March 7, starting at 6:30. We will be in the social hall for both classes. Each class will be limited to a maximum of 16 participants, so please look for announcements in February about signing up for this training.

Pastor's Note

What's in a name? Our worship task force recently spent time talking about a word for our new worship service to begin on March 4. We were looking for an adjective that would describe this new ministry to our community. Was there one word could we put on our outdoor sign and other publicity that would say it all? We brainstormed a list: informal, modern, alternative, praise and worship, family-friendly, non-traditional, new-fangled, co or contemporary. During our planning stage, did not use the word "contemporary" because it is a very popular word that can mean many different things to different people. In the beginning, we wanted to discern how our service would be unique to the vision and needs of our church and community.

So we prayed and we planned. To reach more people for Jesus Christ, especially families with children and others who may be seeking God, we proposed this style of worship: less formal, more participatory, more visual, more creative, with a variety of music and instruments. What one word would help

people driving by to know that we were offering two kinds of worship? Traditional and?

In the end, we chose the word "contemporary" because it is a word used frequently to describe an alternative to traditional worship. It seems to be a familiar word in our culture for talking about worship and we believe will open the door for those who are seeking. Contemporary breaks down into "con"=with and "temp"=time. I'd like to think that we are not just concerned with keeping up with our culture and modern times. That's important but we are in tune with God's time. Providence has often done a good job of letting God lead us. Over these 204 years, we have made many changes to stay contemporary with God's timing. In 2012, God has challenged us to reach more people for Jesus Christ. A "contemporary" worship service is one way we will seek to do it.



Funding for Ministry in 2012

Ministry at Providence United Methodist Church happens through many dedicated people and with resources provided by our congregation. The money given through our regular and special offerings helps fund all that we do in Jesus' name. For the year 2012, the ministry costs that we anticipate through our operating budget will be:

\$456,294

This represents a 13% increase compared to last year. This is a major increase approved by our church council only after prayerful discernment. These dollars represent urgent and life-changing ministries that are central to our call to make disciples for Jesus Christ. We believe that together we can answer this call. Take a look at what God will do through us in 2012:

Inside the walls, many significant educational, caring, worshipful moments will happen every day, not just on Sunday. The lives of more children, youth and adults will be changed through the ministries planned and carried out by our committees and staff:

\$23,360

Outside the walls, mission and ministry will happen through evangelistic outreach, community events like the spring festival, CCHASM, our missionary Kim King Torres and

Branches, CARITAS; and also through our share of district, conference and world-wide ministry including mission in over 100 countries:

\$72,795

Through our excellent staff, we will provide for pastoral leadership and specialized ministries in four different areas. Included are salaries and related expenses for our Pastor, Director of Youth Ministry, Director of Christian Education, Director of Music and Contemporary Music Ministries, nursery worker and two office staff:

\$221,739

In our office, "the word" will get out with the help of copy equipment, printer, computers, paper, supplies and postage expense:

\$12,200

In our church building and on our property, ministries will happen almost every day of the week, including use by many community groups. Included are maintenance costs, utilities, janitorial service, cleaning supplies and a monthly mortgage payment (for capital improvements made in 2006 including an elevator, accessible restrooms and shower, and a new heating and cooling system):

\$126,200

A detailed line-item budget for 2012 is available from the church office.

2011 FINANCIAL UPDATE AND VISION FOR 2012

We have been fortunate in that, even with the slow economy of the last year, our receipts for 2011 **through November** are \$351,831, close to matching 2010's figure of \$356,358. Our expense level is almost exactly the same as 2010 at approximately \$366,000, and while this exceeds our income, that isn't at all unusual for eleven months. Contribution totals are not equal month to month, and historically Decembers see significantly higher giving. As a result, we generally go into each year with a good reserve in the Operating Fund.

For 2012, our budget is 13% higher than 2011. You can read more about the details on page 10, but the

increase reflects several factors, including a visionary plan to reach out to our community through worship, and also remaining obligations for our wonderful HVAC, elevator, and restroom renovations. Meeting this budget will require a positive, intentional commitment by our whole congregation, as we all explore what it means to give a percentage of our income and give sacrificially. The estimate of giving cards submitted to the church office so far for 2012 indicate that, in fact, the average commitment is up by 9%. This is encouraging! Our leaders say, "Whenever there is a need, Providence always comes through." With your increased support we will boldly bring God's love and hope to the world, supporting our mission with renewed vigor!

Providence Road Partners Update

The PUMC outreach with A.M. Davis Elementary School is wrapping up the first semester. Beginning with a very successful school supply drive for the school, volunteers are helping in classrooms, at lunch, the school book fair, and helping teachers with handwork. The PUMC youth cleaned the school "Dragon Trail" and built benches for it.

Sixteen PUMC members joined the A.M. Davis PTA. Church members helped the PTA by collating school packets at the beginning of the school year. See related article elsewhere.

Church members adopted three families (total of 13 children) for Christmas. Another significant project is the adoption of 12 students for a

weekend "backpack" food program. These students, who were identified by staff, will receive a supply of food for each weekend for the remainder of the year.



Next semester, the weekend backpack food program will continue as well as the volunteer activities. If you would like to volunteer to help a student individually, and/or to help a teacher, please contact Jane Logan, 276-2228.
