#### **Mission in Reflection 2012**

As I sit here typing about 2012, I can't help but reflect on all the tragedy that has happened in our country, from Super Storm Sandy to the killing of innocent children at Sandy Hook Elementary School. I know when all of this happens I always say where is God? But he is there with all of the families and all of the helpers who give of their time to make sure people have food, clothes and whatever else they need. Our country has seen so much suffering during 2012 and my heart hurts every time I hear about another tragedy.

But I am so proud of what Providence Church has been able to accomplish in 2012. Your Mission Team and Church have been very busy and I would just like to take a moment to thank everyone who has made it possible to help.

Here is what Your Church has done in 2012. We fed the children at A.M. Davis with our Backpack program and volunteered at the school; our Cooks for Christ fed the homeless every month; our Mission Garden fed so many at the Good Samaritan Inn as well as received a well-deserved award from Chesterfield County Board of Supervisors. We hosted as many as 20 people during the summer who wanted to learn English and what a blessing that was.

Our Upward soccer program was strong and we had as many as 100 children on our fields. We challenged the church to collect for three Thanksgiving boxes for CCHASM but ended up with 12 as well as all the food that was collected on the second Sunday of each month. We clothed countless people at all three of the Homeward Events this year. We housed 40 women for CARITAS this year. Oh, I almost forgot the eight families at A. M. Davis that had Christmas because of YOU as well as all the stockings that were filled for the Salvation Army. Through your kind hearts and donations we have been able to assist so many families. Christ is ALIVE and He is right here at Providence United Methodist Church.

As 2012 comes to an end you can be proud of everything that WE as a Church did for our community and my prayer is that you will continue to support our efforts in 2013. It is never too late to get involved.

May God Bless you and keep you and your family safe in 2013.

But the recession, changing needs in our community, and individual family economics have lead us to this point.

school the boost it would need to thrive, including \$24,000 in financial support and many prayers. Over these recent years, the preschool continued to reach and teach these special children and we are grateful that we were able to do everything possible. But now the time has come to move on. We are thankful for the Preschool Committee, chaired by Mary Elliott. Our prayers are for the children, their families, and the staff as they find other places to learn and work. Our prayer is also that God will guide us as a congregation as we ask the question, "What is next?"

#### Funding for Ministry in 2013

Ministry at Providence United Methodist Church happens through many dedicated people and with resources provided by our congregation. The money given through our regular and special offerings helps fund all that we do in Jesus' name. For the year 2013, the ministry costs that we anticipate through our operating budget will be: \$439.492

While the total budget number is smaller than last year, actual expenses will be about the same as 2012. We expect that this will be another financially challenging but exciting ministry year. Take a look at what God will do through us in 2013:

Inside the walls, many significant educational, caring, worshipful moments will happen every day, not just on Sunday. The lives of more children, youth and adults will be changed through the ministries planned and carried out by our committees and staff: \$18.650

Outside the walls, mission and ministry will happen through evangelistic outreach, community events like the spring festival, CCHASM, our missionary Kim King Torres and Branches, CARITAS, and also

How can we bring Christ's loving care to hurting people when they need it the most?

through our share of district, conference and worldwide ministry including mission in over 100 countries: \$69,108

Through our excellent staff, we will provide for pastoral leadership and specialized ministries in four different areas. Included are salaries and related expenses for our Pastor, Director of Youth Ministry, Director of Christian Education, Director of Music and Contemporary Worship Ministries, nursery worker and two office staff: \$224.134

In our office, "the word" will get out with the help of copy equipment, printers, computers, paper, supplies and postage expense: \$10,900

In our church building and on our property, ministries will happen almost every day of the week, including use by many community groups. Included are maintenance costs, utilities, janitorial service, cleaning supplies and a monthly mortgage payment (for capital improvements made in 2006 including an elevator, accessible restrooms and shower, and a new heating and cooling system): \$115.700

A detailed line-item budget for 2013 is available from the church office.
