



It is easy to spot Providence UMC members bursting with God's grace as they enthusiastically strive to help everyone belong, be transformed by God's love, and make a positive difference in the world. What's not always as obvious is the generous financial giving that supports all of our ministries.

Thanks to your generosity, and the careful use of resources, we ended 2013 on solid financial ground. Total giving for the year was \$419,826.33. up from \$402,188.69 in 2012. Even accounting for a \$15,000 gift given during the year, giving was still higher than 2012. Total expenditures for 2013 were \$401,109.50, down from \$415,885.97 in 2012. Much of the reduction in expenditures can be attributed to multiple staff vacancies at various times which reduced salary costs. At the end of the year the operating fund balance was a healthy \$29,989,69. We end the year with all bills paid. apportionments paid, and with adequate operating reserves.

That being said, we believe that 2014, as budgeted, anticipating filling staff positions and funding all of the ministries of the church, represents a challenge which requires all of us to grow in generosity as we grow in faith. This year also presents an opportunity to improve the financial position of the church by reducing construction debt we carry from the "Building on our Faith" project. Currently we pay a monthly mortgage payment for that debt, but we have the opportunity to substantially reduce that expense, and free additional funds for ministry goals.
