CCHASM

Do you know what **CCHASM** stands for, who belongs, what they do or how you can help?

Chesterfield-Colonial Heights Alliance of Social Ministries is an organization in the Chesterfield-Colonial Heights area that takes the burden from the church offices when the needy ask for help with rent, electric bills, water bills, food, etc. CCHASM is able to talk with them, check them out through Social Services and help with their problems.

In order to do this, CCHASM needs money. The churches that send their requests to them become member churches. There are now 112 member churches. Member churches are asked to send \$300 at the beginning of each year for administrative costs. The remainder of the year, the member churches are asked to send money that pays for the requests. PUMC has designated its Thanksgiving fund for CCHASM.

Each church is assigned to one of 16 food pantries to take the food we collect. The pantry that PUMC takes its food to is Southminster Presbyterian on Hull Street.



CCHASM asks for special donations of food at Thanksgiving and boxes are given away at the Fair Grounds for those who have applied and have been approved.

With the price of food going up, it will be harder for those in need to eat so they will be depending on us more and more. If you have any questions, call Shirley Hudson at 276-2495. If she doesn't already know the

Pastor's Note

Have you ever wondered why we place things in our worship service as we do? Why is there a hymn of praise first and a benediction last? Why does communion always come after the sermon and not before? Starting last year, the worship committee began looking at the basic pattern for worship that is found on page 3 in the front of our hymnal. We noticed that the traditional pattern that is outlined there has four sections called Entrance. Proclamation and Response, Thanksgiving, and Sending Forth. We gather, praise God, hear God's word, respond, give thanks and go out. It made sense to us that we first hear God's word (through scripture, anthems, hymns and sermon), then we respond to what we have heard and felt (with our prayers, time at the altar, hymns of response, and giving our gifts). There may also be Holy Communion and Baptisms on a given Sunday.

This pattern makes sense to us, both Biblically and theologically. God speaks to us and we respond. So we have decided to pattern our worship in this way. The main difference to us will be that the offering will be in the response time, following the sermon.
