
Pastor's Note

Recently I noticed a basket in the lobby of the downtown YMCA. In it were multiple strips of white paper. The sign on the basket said, "A Scripture for Today. Choose One." Now, each time I go to the "Y", I choose a scripture from the basket. I read it and think about it on the walk home. If Bob and I are walking together, we share them with each other.

There are many ways to stay connected with the Bible. The "Upper Room", a daily devotional available in the church foyer, has a scripture reading for each day. You can choose to read through a book of the Bible. I would suggest starting with the Gospel of Mark. through the whole Bible between now and Pentecost, May 27. When you are at the church, check out the display near the library and pick up a reading for one or more days that week. You can read them at home, read them aloud, share them together if there are others in your home, asking simple questions: What does this say? What does this mean? What does this mean to me? You may also choose to read them aloud in the church sanctuary.

Why do we read and study the Bible? It is the primary way that God speaks to us. Take time this month to read, and to listen. It will change your life.
