A Letter to the People of Providence

On a recent Sunday, our church focused on outreach evangelism. We discussed how the word "evangelism" has gotten a bad rap because of pushy techniques and high-profile televangelists who fell hard. But we'd like to reclaim the word, because it means "to share the good news." We believe that there is a short supply of "good news" in our world and it is up to all of us to share what we know.

Our good news centers on Jesus. There are three questions that you can answer for yourself that will help you be more confident in sharing and inviting others. Why do people need Jesus? My answer is: Jesus offers us the way of salvation, forgiveness of our sins through God's love, and wholeness of body, mind and spirit. Because of Jesus we can have abundant and eternal life. There is nothing quite like it. How would you put it into words from your own experience?

The second question: Why do people need the church? At our workshop, people talked about the comfort of not being alone in difficult

times, the joy of worship with others, learning from each other in study groups, and working together to make a difference. Can you imagine bagging 40,000 pounds of sweet potatoes to help alleviate hunger all by yourself?

The third question: Why do people need Providence United Methodist Church? The truth is that our church will not be the church for everyone. But we offer excellent ministry opportunities that you can tell someone else about, and it may be just what they are looking for. What are the things about Providence that get you excited? What are the things that we do well, that have brought you closer to God or changed your life?

If you have an answer to these three questions, then you have some good news to share. Now...who, in particular, needs to hear it?
