# Pastor's Note

How does a preacher know what to preach? It begins with prayer, scripture and a pastor knowing the needs of the community of faith. Much of the time, I am guided by the lectionary readings which are a three year cycle of readings from the whole Bible, and which cover all the major portions of the gospels. Many preachers, across denominational lines, use the lectionary as a guide to preaching. So you may hear a sermon on the same scripture on the same day if you visit another church in our community. These readings match up with the church year, during which we celebrate holy seasons such as Christmas, Easter and Pentecost.

Other times, I may choose scripture and themes that relate to the concerns and spiritual needs of the congregation. This will be affected by what's going on in the life of our church, community and world. Sometimes someone will say to me, "You should preach a sermon on this or that!" I try to stay in tune with the Holy Spirit and study the scriptures to see what God may be saying to us as a congregation. It is a humbling task and I appreciate your prayers as I prepare each week for the "relentless return of the Sabbath."

This summer I am inviting your questions and input as I plan my preaching. Check out the article on page 2 in this newsletter on how to submit a question or a scripture for my prayerful consideration.

Thank you for your careful listening each week. However, the sermon doesn't end during worship on Sunday. It continues the rest of the week as you think about the scripture, my words, your life and how God is leading you in faithful discipleship. May God help us all to listen and to respond.
