Pastor's Note

Have you ever been "down in the dumps?" I'm not sure where this expression came from, but we all know what it means. We've been discouraged, or depressed, or just down, emotionally and spiritually. The writer of Psalm 130 knew about this as well: "Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!" All of us been there. Sometimes it is our work, or our family situation, or something that happens at school or with a close friend, or even at church. We may just try to deal with it ourselves, or talk with a friend. But do we go to God when we are feeling our worst? Maybe we think we shouldn't. We should only talk to God when we are feeling confident, thankful, joyful, hopeful.

But the psalm writer knew better. We can go to God <u>especially</u> when we are feeling down, and this Psalm gives us the words to say if we don't have our own. I hope you will use the words of Psalm 130 to guide your prayers this month, and in the future. God already knows what we are going through. Reaching out to God is the first step in our healing.
