Providence Road Partners

The Providence Road Partners, a.k.a. Davis Elementary School Project, coordinates PUMC's efforts to support the educational program and students at the elementary school. During the first year of the project, PUMC provided school supplies for student use during the school year, provided Christmas gifts for eight needy families, book fair gift certificates for 68 students, and treat bags for 95 teachers and staff in March. PUMC member donations and proceeds from a Wednesday night supper, prepared by Valerie Reese, supported the activities.

PUMC volunteers helped with school bus unloading and loading and helped guide kindergarten students to classrooms during the first week of school. PUMC members were classroom helpers, lunch buddies, mentors, assisted in after-school ESL supervision and library book fairs, greeted parents and children

on kindergarten registration day, and provided clerical help.


