has worked in music education. She lives in Manakin Sabot, VA with her husband, Frank, and their three children, Annie, Jonathan and Allison.


In January 2012, the position of Director of Contemporary Music was created to provide leadership for our new Connections worship

A Report on Worship Attendance

The graph at the right charts our worship attendance for 2012 and compares 2012 with 2011. The information reveals that that the average attendance varies significantly month by month. April is usually higher because of Easter. The summer is usually lower because of vacations. You will notice that after March 4, the early service attendance



increased as some of you shifted from one service to another and new folks have joined us. The total average attendance, in spite of a lower July (due to storms and outdoor worship), is up for 2012 at 256, compared to 2011 at 254.

Pastor's Note

What do the numbers tell us? (See graph.) They tell us that we have work to do! Since we have seats available on Sunday morning at both 9 am and 11 am, I would like to ask you to do two things. First, starting in September, recommit yourself to regular worship attendance. It is the one time in the week when we can fellowship with our church family, be inspired by wonderful music, and hear God's word for our daily lives. God desires our worship and commands us to keep the Sabbath. Faithful weekly worship by those of you who are members would help us more than reach our goal of 276 for 2012.

Second, reach out to invite someone new. Usually in September, people are thinking

about making a fresh start. We made significant changes this year in order to offer two different worship experiences. Tell your friends and neighbors about our two services and meet them here. It could make all the difference in their lives. I know that some of you have been inviting others to come. Thank you! The seeds you are planting are bearing fruit. What a wonderful, loving, serving, growing congregation we have here at Providence. With your help, the numbers will show what we already know.

Family: Many Forms, Common Faith

For the month of September, Providence UMC will be celebrating the Christian home. We are doing so to develop and strengthen faith in the home; celebrate and support Christian families in their faith journey, and celebrate Christian Home Month

As the title implies, families come in many shapes and sizes. Whether you are single, a couple, married with children, divorced with children, empty nesters, or another way that makes up your family, the home is where your Christian faith is really developed. Though the church tries to help mold that faith, it is ultimately up to the family to make it work. That is why for the month of September we are really going to be focusing on ways your family can connect and grow in your faith.

For the month of September, we have some family activities at church for you to attend and some suggestions for you and your "family" to do at home that focus on "Hope":

Remember your blessings, individually and as a family. Set one night a week (at least) to eat dinner together as a family.

- Faith 5—A commitment to spend 5 minutes either in the morning or in the evening to walk through these 5 steps (check out the web-site http://www.faithink.com/ for more: inkubators/faith5.asp).
 - 1. Share your highs and lows of the days
 - Read a scripture verse from Sunday's sermon or another verse that you feel like reading
 - Talk about how the highs and lows relate to the scripture (is God actually saying something to you?)
 - Pray for one another's highs and lows
 - 5. Bless one another before going to bed
- Study scripture together. Some of the key scripture passages that mention a source of hope: Genesis 8:6-22, Genesis 21:1-7, Joshua 4:1-7, Psalm 23, Psalm 65, Matthew 5:1-14, Matthew 28:1-10, Matthew 28:16-20, Romans 8:38-39. Ask one family member to read the scripture. After hearing the scripture ask each family member to say what that particular scripture means to them.

PRESCHOOL NEWS



Finance Committee

As we start the last third of 2012, we want to give you a snapshot of finances for Providence as of July 31.

Our budget for 2012 represents a significant increase over 2011 in part because of mortgage payments now included in the budget and other. The payments represent renovations in 2005 that made our church accessible and a new HVAC. A recent gift directed toward the principal has reduced the balance of the loan by about 10% to now less than \$185,000. All bills and our share of conference apportionments are up-to-date and our operating fund balance is an adequate \$16,842.

The numbers at the right show that giving to the budget in 2012 is below 2011 and expenses are above 2011.

Receipts	\$237,891	\$231,792
Disbursements	\$233,940	\$239,715

If we were spending at budgeted levels through July, disbursements would be \$266,171. Fortunately there have been no major maintenance issues and utilities expenses are down and committees have continued to be careful with their expenses.

So over the next four months we ask that you prayerfully consider fulfilling your pledge, as well as going a step above. With everyone doing their part we can finish 2012 in a record breaking way and all ministries can be fully funded.
