
Upward soccer games begin Saturday, September 7 and continue through November 9. Games are at 9:00 and 10:00 a.m.





Giving in the second quarter remained on track with fairly strong months in May and June following a slow start in April. July, traditionally a slow giving month, has started the third quarter off slowly; hopefully we will gain some momentum during August and into the fall.

Giving for the year remains on track and comparable to 2012. Expenses have been less year-to-date in 2013 than 2012 and that coupled with a strong cash position to start the year due to a large year-end gift have helped the PUMC Operating Fund remain solid.
