
Prayer Service for Newly Elected Leaders





Missions Minutes





Giving for the month of September was higher than September of last year at \$33,379, and year-to-date giving outpaces last year by a modest \$3500. Expenses for the year however have been greater than giving by \$11,522. To avoid the operating fund dipping below an acceptable level, the church deferred the September apportionment payment. Apportionments

are how our church participates, along with all other United Methodist churches, in supporting the ministry efforts of the worldwide United Methodist denomination. While it is not unusual for giving to decline during the summer months, we can all strive toward the example of our Heavenly Father, whom the psalmist wrote of in Psalm 100:5 saying "For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations." Just as God's commitment to us is steadfast, let us each resolve joyfully to fulfill the financial commitments we have made to our church.
