I can now add tweeting to my list of attempts to be relevant. This has nothing to do with birds. It is a way of communicating electronically in 140 characters or

less. For tweeting to make any sense, you have to have "followers." And to have followers, you either have to be famous, have loyal friends, or have something interesting to say. We'll see how it goes . . .

What makes it relevant is that it comes out of your everyday experience and speaks to someone else's everyday experience.

#### **Generosity Sunday**






