

Why Do I Get a Building Fund Envelope Each Month?

In 2006, PUMC completed a building project that included the elevator, handicap accessible restrooms, showers, and a new HVAC system. We are fortunate to have such great facilities that enable our church to be inclusive of everyone as we do the exciting work that God has given us. The project cost about \$800,000. Through very faithful giving, the balance of the church's mortgage on this project is down to \$219,714.

Our mortgage payments amount to about \$26,000 a year. We have been blessed that some of you have given second-mile gifts by using the Building Fund envelopes which go directly to these payments. So far this year we have not needed to use other current gifts to make most of the payments. While our mortgage payments are included in our 2012 operating budget, so are many other important new and growing ministries. Any gifts received in the Building Fund envelopes will be applied directly to our mortgage loan balance, and will allow Providence to continue and expand all of our other wonderful ministries. 2012 will be a wonderful **and** challenging year! Coming in January – Extended Preschool Hours

To respond to the needs of our community and to continue to make a difference, we are planning to explore offering extended, before-and-after care for the students of our Preschool, beginning in January, 2012. We will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. to accommodate families in need of extended-day child care in addition to our current Preschool program.

A child may be dropped off beginning at 6:30 a.m., and will attend Preschool from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Following Preschool, a child can stay with us until 6:00 p.m. During the extended afternoon, the child will eat lunch, and participate in ageappropriate activities such as circle and story time, arts and



crafts, center time, math and science and creative movement. The skills and concepts learned in preschool will be reinforced in a more relaxed atmosphere. There will be outside time, as well as a rest or nap time daily, appropriate to the age of the child.



Did you know that children in our community are **hungry this weekend**? There are 25 students at A. M. Davis Elementary School who need meals on the weekends. For \$12 a week or \$324 for the remainder of the school year, you can provide food for these students to feed them until they return to school each Monday.
