
The Ruritans motto is Fellowship, Good Will, and Community Service. And, we believe that the way to grow Ruritan is to "JUST ASK" someone to join.

It's time to relax. We will extend the time to 8:00 p.m. so we can watch an entire movie.



Canned Food Drive


